The Connecticut Food Bank annually distributes more than 15 million pounds of food to six of the state's eight counties. Donations come from the food industry, through community member and corporate contributions, and via government subsidies.

At the CT Food Bank donations are organized and sorted by products before they are distributed at the warehouses. Member programs

send representatives to the warehouses to shop for food that is then distributed to those who need it most at local food pantries, soup kitchens and emergency shelters.

They have a natural hot springs that leaves the ground at 160 degrees. I'm the Communications Coordinator for my local Peace Corps group and just received the message below. For those of you interested in participating in a survey

for a grad student's PhD dissertation on Peace Corps & the effects of volunteering on people's lives, read on:

"My name is Meghan Kallman, and I am a PhD candidate in the department of sociology at Brown University, in Providence, Rhode Island. I am writing a dissertation about the relationship between organizations and social change work. I am interested in civic participation, the third sector, and development; in other words, what happens when people try to make their worlds better, and what do formal organizations have to do with that process?

I have elected to write my dissertation on the Peace Corps because I am interested in the effects of volunteering on people's lives: how are volunteers' biographies, identities, and politics shaped by participation? How do individual volunteers carry their Peace Corps experience with them throughout their lives and careers? How does this sort of international service experience permanently affect people?

As a part of it, I have created a survey for RPCVs asking about their experiences abroad. I would be extremely grateful if you would distribute it to your listsery, via Facebook or your social media outlets, and to any other RPCVs in your personal or professional networks. The link is here:

Dear Peace Corps Family,

March provides us with a special opportunity to renew and reflect on

the Peace Corps' longstanding commitment to women's and girls' empowerment. In the United States, March is Women's History Month and March 8 also marks International Women's Day. The 2014 themes for these observances, respectively, are "Celebrating Women of Character, Courage, and Commitment," and "Inspiring Change." The Peace Corps recognizes the value of programs to promote women's participation in all aspects of development. Enshrined in the Peace Corps Act is the directive that "Peace Corps programs shall give particular attention to programs, projects, and activities which tend to integrate women into the national economies of developing countries, thus improving their status and assisting the total development effort."

And the Peace Corps continues that commitment in all that we do. In the past year, just as in every year, the Peace Corps has undertaken projects that promote the participation of women and girls in all of the countries we serve. Peace Corps/Armenia conducted educational presentations and distributed literature on human trafficking in six of Armenia's 11 regions. Peace Corps/Lesotho hosted a Camp GLOW for 196 girls in November. In Ecuador, a PCV worked with a local organization, the Waaponi Foundation, to promote rural women as citizens who can be involved in the public life of their parishes and cantons. In Morocco, that country's gender and development committee introduced a new sexual harassment toolkit including three videos featuring Moroccans discussing sexual harassment.

Wherever the country, whatever the activity, I am honored to oversee an organization that sees the empowerment of women and girls as so central to its humanitarian mission. I encourage you to pause for a moment during this month to consider how the world is a better place when women and girls are living out their true potential.
