Nominations open for the Harris Wofford Global Citizen Award - deadline October 31

The National Peace Corps Association's Harris Wofford Global Citizen Award is named for the former U.S. Senator and special assistant to U.S. President John F. Kennedy who was instrumental in the formation of the Peace Corps. It is given annually to an outstanding global leader who grew up and continues to live in a country where Peace Corps Volunteers served and whose life was influenced by the Peace Corps. We invite NPCA member groups to identify and nominate candidates for this award.

Past winners of this award are:

- 2011 Atiku Abubakar of Nigeria
- 2013 Dr. Mohamud Sheikh Nurein Said of Kenya
- 2014 Dr. Surin Pitsuwan of Thailand

NEW! Education Small Grants

We are pleased to announce a new small grants program for members and member groups with grants of up to \$500 awarded quarterly to fund community projects/events that promote Peace Corps' Third Goal. This goal is to "strengthen Americans' understanding about the world and its peoples" by way of returned and current volunteers, as well as friends of the Peace Corps, sharing their Peace Corps experience and host country culture. These grants are intended to educate Americans about other peoples and countries of the world. The project must be short term (less than one month) and of a local scope and scale. Projects will engage with local schools, libraries, and/or community organizations.

Applications and supporting materials will be accepted on a rolling basis. Applications will be reviewed and awarded quarterly. Learn more and download the application from
