Take I-84

Get off at Exit 7 (Left handed exit when heading north toward Hartford.) Follow exit for almost a mile to the first exit (Exit 11) that is Federal Rd. End of ramp at light make a left.

(You will be crossing old Rt. 7 now called Federal Road just in case you decide not to take I-84). Continue straight for $3\ 1/2$ miles.

Go straight, through a series of 3 quick lights.

(You're on Candlewood Lake Road. On right will be Kohl's Dept. Store; on left Office Max & a strip mall.)

Go straight at a stop light and a blinking yellow light.

Continue on the main road. You'll see a small row of stores on the right. Immediately past the stores <u>on the left</u> there will be a sign for Candlewood Shores.

Make a left into Candlewood Shores.

Go up and over hill.

Count roads on your <u>right</u> because you will want to take your 5th right <u>just at the bottom of the hill</u>, which is Twilight Lane.

The Connecticut Food Bank annually distributes more than 15 million pounds of food to six of the state's eight counties. Donations come from the food industry, through community member and corporate contributions, and via government subsidies.

At the CT Food Bank donations are organized and sorted by products before they are distributed at the warehouses. Member programs send representatives to the warehouses to shop for food that is then distributed to those who need it most at local food pantries, soup kitchens and emergency shelters.
