CTRPCV will sort food on April 21

The Connecticut Food Bank annually distributes more than 15 million pounds of food to six of the state's eight counties. Donations come from the food industry, through community member and corporate contributions, and via government subsidies.

At the CT Food Bank donations are organized and sorted by products before they are distributed at the warehouses. Member programs send representatives to the warehouses to shop for food that is then distributed to those who need it most at local food pantries, soup kitchens and emergency shelters.

I make use of these online texts in two of my international and crosscultural education courses at Eastern CT State University. The Building Bridges guide is a good introductory text on culture and intercultural relations, with activities and exercises for middle and high school classrooms. The Culture Matters workbook is designed for Peace Corps volunteers and focuses on styles of communication, culture in the workplace, adjusting to a new culture, and social relationships. Both explore American culture and generalizations, diversity within our nation, and potential cultural misunderstandings for Americans living in other nations.

We don't have specific addresses of places to eat. etc. We just explored the area (as a PCV does) and found many things. There are Walgreens around, K-mart, GPS and cell phones work fine.
