News about Maureen Shanley, CTRPCV President, from Patty Zelle, Maureen's sister, on Wednesday, August 21, 2013:

Hello All,

Maureen fell and shattered the femur just above my knee. The doctor said that the leg would be non-weight bearing until at least 11/1/13 and then the next phase of therapy will begin to retrain the muscles in the injured leg.

I was with Maureen for her staple removal last Thursday. It was very hard for her. I stayed and massaged her shoulders and helped her with breathing to relax, which she said helped a lot!

Needless, to say that wiped her out. For those of you who don't know, she had a blood transfusion the week before shortly after surgery and had to go back to the hospital via ambulette and then back to Bethel. It helped a lot. Prior to that she was fighting fever and weakness. The past several days have been moving forward.

Maureen says that the pain comes and goes... but every day is better than the day before. Her day is busy with: 4-6 hours using a CPM machine that moves her leg to keep the knee lubricated, a daily occupational therapy session, and a physical therapy session. But Maureen says that she looks back at the week before and realizes that she is indeed making progress every week. Granted it might not be big changes, but there is progress.

Connecticut Quest for Peace sends Computers to Nicaragua

In addition to being president of CTRPCV, I am also VP of Connecticut Quest for Peace. Connecticut Quest for Peace is a 501(C)3 nonprofit organization founded in 1985 by a group of dedicated individuals whose mission is to help the poorest people of Nicaragua. Connecticut Quest for Peace seeks to improve the lives of the poor in Nicaragua by working through proven Nicaraguan organizations to provide humanitarian aid in a variety of educational choices, health care, arts, and microfinance initiatives primarily directed toward women and children.

Thanks to a donation of \$1,000 from CTRPCV, Connecticut Quest for Peace sent and will connect to the internet 10 computers (laptops) in two very rural schools in Somotillo, Nicaragua. These computers will not only be used to teach children valuable computer skills that can transfer into better job opportunities, but they will also open the "world" to this poor, tiny, rural community in northern Nicaragua. At night these computers will also be used by townspeople for a small fee. Thus the school can use the computers to pay for the school's internet charges and the townspeople will have an inexpensive way to broaden their world.

# **Advocacy for the Peace Corps**

Have you ever been inspired to speak to your local Congressman or Senator to discuss the value of Peace Corps service and the need to expand Peace Corps efforts internationally or thank them for supporting Peace Corps endeavors in the past? Join the hundreds of Return Peace Corps volunteers advocating for Peace Corps locally. If you are interested in participating follow the steps below. Every volunteer has a unique story to share of their service. Sharing your story, may impact government to continue Peace Corps service. Follow the steps below if you would like to advocate in Connecticut. **Step 1:** The first step is to go to the bottom of our August District Advocacy Page <u>-</u>

http://www.peacecorpsconnect.org/district-meeting-days/ to see if anyone is listed yet as planning to help coordinate meetings in your region. If someone is listed, please contact them to express your interest in participating or assisting. **This is very important,** as the National Return Peace Corps Association wants to make sure they don't have multiple people requesting a meeting with the same congressional office.

**Step 2: If no one is listed** for your area and you are willing to organize one or more meetings in your area, contact the National Return Peace Corps Association at advocacy@peacecorpsconnect.org today. Let them know

where you live and what office (or offices) you would like to organize a meeting with.

In the coming days, the National Peace Corps Association will reach out to you with some basic instructions on how to schedule meetings with your district offices. You will take the lead on scheduling the meeting and (if possible), finding 1 - 3 other local RPCVs to form an advocacy team. The National Peace Corps Association will help provide you with participants if necessary. They will also provide you with background materials and key talking points to help you plan and prepare for your meetings.

#### Washington Nationals' Peace Corps Night
