**ACCEPTANCE & AWARDS**: Jurors will review artwork. Applicants will be notified of acceptance by email. Awards TBD.

**LOGISTICS**: Every booth is a 10x10' corner (pods of 4) with 2 sides open to the public and 1 foot for storage. Artists are responsible for set up assisted by available volunteers. Canopy tents are suggested. Weights are required. Secure all displays for public safety. There is no limit to the number of pieces you can exhibit.

**SALES:** Sales are handled by the vendor with no commission taken. You may sell art, prints, other artistic work and future commissions. We suggest you are equipped to accept credit cards. To sell goods in CT, tax numbers are required. They can be acquired at <u>ct.gov/drs/lib/drs/</u><u>filllable\_applications/reg-1.pdf</u> for a fee.

**VOLUNTEERS**: Consider lending help and expertise in areas of marketing, administration and fundraising. We need help building signs, poster distribution, and more.
